NZ: frontline border staff and their families


Morocco: Healthcare professionals 40+

Every state has started widely vaccinating older adults, though the minimum eligibility age varies across the country.





Top Three Concerns

Dilution Errors

- Administering non-diluted vaccine
- Administering incorrectly diluted vaccine
- Administering only the diluent

Vaccine Waste

- Accessing labeled quantity
- Scheduling issues

Errors with Second Dose

- Second dose given when not needed
- Second dose given late due to vaccine shortage
- Incorrect manufacturer given for second dose



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Other Notable Concerns

Flu-Like Symptoms

• Results in low staffing in healthcare facilities the day after staff is vaccinated
