



Use of "strong opioids" 2010-2020






Figur 1. Antall narkotikautløste dødsfall i perioden 2010 – 2021. Norge.










- No marketing of opioids since 2009
- Strong warning from The Norwegian Directorate of Health (2021): Opioids should not be offered to patients with longstanding pain not due to cancer.
- Updated product information emphasizing the risk of addiction (2022): Repeated use of oxycodone can lead to drug dependence, even at therapeutic doses. The risk of drug dependence may vary depending on a patient's individual risk factors, dosage, and duration of opioid treatment (PRAC/EMA).
- Criteria for reimbursement of opioids are evaluated (2022)
- Tools are developed so that doctors and patients can cope with pain without using drugs (2022)



Other initiatives to prevent addiction and help those who have developed addictions.

- The Parliament will discuss a new prevention and treatment reform in the drug field (2023).
- The Norwegian Directorate of Health has developed a guide for interdisciplinary pain clinics (2021).
- The Norwegian Directorate of Health is preparing "National patient pathways" for patients with complex pain conditions (2022).
- The Norwegian Directorate of Health has proposed a new strategy to reduce the number of overdoses (2022).
- SERAF: Point-project (Preventing an opioid epidemic In Norway: Focusing on treatment of chronic pain).
